Sat. 11/3 "Coco", 2017, 1h 45m **3pm**

In Disney Pixar's vibrant tale of family, fun and adventure, an aspiring young musician named Miguel embarks on an extraordinary journey to the magical land of his ancestors. There, the charming trickster Héctor becomes an unexpected friend who helps Miguel uncover the mysteries behind his family's stories and traditions.

Sun. 11/4 "All The Money In The World", 2017, 2h 12m **3pm/7:30pm**

All the Money in the World follows the kidnapping of 16-year-old John Paul Getty III (*Charlie Plummer*) and the desperate attempt by his devoted mother, Gail (*Michelle Williams*), to convince his billionaire grandfather (*Christopher Plummer*) to pay the ransom. When Getty Sr. refuses, Gail attempts to sway him as her son's captors become increasingly volatile and brutal. With her son's life in the balance, Gail and Getty Sr.'s advisor (Mark Wahlberg) become unlikely allies in the race against time that ultimately reveals the true and lasting value of love over money.

Sat. 11/10 "To Be or Not To Be", 1942, 1h 39m **3pm**

This 1942 comedy manages to eke out barrels of laughs from a contentious time in history, World War II. Joseph Tura (*Jack Benny*) leads a ragtag band of actors in Poland who come to the aid of an American soldier (Robert Stack) who needs help carrying out his work in the Resistance efforts. But it turns out that Tura's wife (*Carole Lombard*) is having an affair with the military man, which severely undercuts Tura's sympathies for the soldier.

Sun. 11/11 "The Imitation Game", 2014, 1h 54m **3pm/7:30pm**

Chronicling mathematical wizard Alan Turing's key role in Britain's successful effort to crack Germany's Enigma code during World War II, this historical biopic also recounts how his groundbreaking work helped launch the computer age. Cast: *Benedict Cumberbatch, Keira Knightley.*

Sat. 11/17 "The Shop Around The Corner", 1940, 1h 38m **3pm**

In Ernst Lubitsch's charming, Budapest-set romance -- later remade as the Meg Ryan-Tom Hanks vehicle *You've Got Mail* -- Klara (*Margaret Sullavan*) and Alfred (*James Stewart*) fall in love, even though they've only met before as pen pals and don't even know each other's names. Over Alfred's objections, Klara is hired in the shop where he works. But as they continue their loving correspondence, they embark on a combative working relationship.

Sun. 11/18 "The Notebook", 2004, 2h 3m **3pm/7:30pm**

Two young lovers are torn apart by war and class differences in the 1940s in this adaptation of Nicholas Sparks' best-selling novel. Their story is told by a man who, years later, reads from a notebook while he visits a woman in a nursing home. Cast: *Ryan Gosling, Rachel McAdams.*

Sat. 11/24 "Cactus Flower", 1969, 1h 43m **3pm**

Commitment-phobic Julian Winston (*Walter Matthau*) has been able to keep his girlfriend, Toni (*Goldie Hawn*), at bay by pretending to be stuck in a loveless marriage. But when Toni insists on meeting his missus, Julian's forced to recruit his assistant (*Ingrid Bergman*) to pose as his wife. Based on the play by Jean-Pierre Grédy, this lighthearted 1960s-era comedy is directed by filmmaker Gene Saks.

Sun. 11/25 "Book Club", 2018, 1h 44m **3pm/7:30pm**

Friends and members of the 60-plus set, Diane, Jane, Sharon and Carol have seen it all when it comes to relationships. But after reading "Fifty Shades of Grey," they're inspired to make bold choices in the romance department, with hilarious results. Cast: *Diane Keaton, Jane Fonda, Candice Bergen.*

- 1 Thursday** Slow-simmered Beef Stew with fresh baked bread.
- 2 Friday** Chicken Margherita boneless breast of chicken topped with mozzarella, parmesan, tomatoes and fresh basil over pasta, with green peas.
- 3 Saturday** Baked Virginia Ham with rum raisin sauce (or without), scalloped potatoes and broccoli florets.
- 4 Sunday** Grilled Lamb Chops & mint jelly, roasted red potatoes and roasted butternut squash.

- 5 Monday** Home-made Lasagna with sautéed fresh fennel.
- 6 Tuesday** Carne Asada, marinated and grilled skirt steak with Spanish rice, chopped tomatoes, guacamole and sour cream.

- 7 Wednesday** Baked Atlantic Haddock with lemon butter crumbs, roasted tomatoes and sautéed fresh spinach with pine nuts.

- 8 Thursday** Wild Mushroom Ravioli Marsala with garlic bread and sautéed fresh zucchini.
- 9 Friday** Fried Chicken with corn bread, and collard greens sautéed with bacon and onion.
- 10 Saturday** Oven-roasted Pork Tenderloin with pan gravy (or without), roasted sweet potatoes and herbed fresh cauliflower.

- 11 Sunday** Grilled Sirloin Steak with garlic butter, baked potato and mashed butternut squash. **(HH without garlic butter) LS/GF**
- 12 Monday** Chicken Nantucket Stew, chicken with peppers, onions, mushrooms with a lemon cream sauce, served over a puff pastry shell.
- 13 Tuesday** Shrimp Pot Stickers with egg roll, fried rice and a fortune cookie.
- 14 Wednesday** Pecan-crust & Seared Salmon with lemon beurre blanc, haricot vert and lemon orzo.

- 15 Thursday** Spaghetti and Turkey Meatballs with marinara sauce and sautéed kale. **HH/LS**
- 16 Friday** Pan-seared U10 Scallops, potato puree, roasted root vegetables. **HH/LS**

- 20 Tuesday** Chicken Madeira sautéed with bell peppers, chorizo and kale, tossed with ziti and fresh chives.
- 21 Wednesday** Individual Meatloaf with mashed potatoes and peas.
- 22 Thursday, 2-5pm THANKSGIVING:** Hand-carved Slow-roasted Tom Turkey w/ sausage stuffing, mashed potatoes, candied sweet potatoes, corn, green beans, cranberry sauce, pumpkin pie, or pecan pie.
- 23 Friday** Fish and Chips with lemon, tartar sauce, and coleslaw.
- 24 Saturday** Roasted Duck Breast a l'Orange with wild rice and sautéed sugar snap peas.
